
WHAT THE BOY SCOUTS ARE DOING

Troop 5. Three new members have been registered by this troop and have received their certificates. They are Walter Durr, George Durr, and Harry Webster.



JOE HULL, Quarterback




SEYMOUR JACKSON, Center
