STORM INTERFERED WITH TRAILING Icy Rails and Trolley Wires Broke Up the Regular Schedules —Norwich Car at Willimantic Left Track and Plunged Across Road, But No One Was Injured. The downfall of Wednesday, that began early in the day and lasted at intervals until midnight, when there was another lull, and varied from rain to sleet and then to snow, put Norwich under a pretty solid three-inch white blanket and brought a real winterish touch to New Year's week. Incidentally, the sleet and the ice falling and freezing on the trolley wires broke up all the schedules of the trolley system and the railroads, and the prospects of a freeze-up kept the trolley men apprehensive and active until midnight Wednesday night.

The front of the car tore down the fence at that point and projected through over the four foot drop to the yard of the American Thread company, only the fact that the rear wheel struck the track kept the car from plunging over the wall. In its path it missed the telegraph pole at that spot by only a few feet. The car was under the control of Conductor John Gleason and Motor-man James Rutherford, both of whom stuck to their posts and calmed the passengers. The air pipe broke when the car left the track and the brakes did not get any grip. A peculiar fact was that the trolley pole stayed on the wire and the lights were not cut off. The car was proceeding at a rate not over four miles an hour when the accident occurred but the weight of the body and the weight of the car on the tracks stopped at the railroad crossing it was after ten o'clock when the car was on the rail again, near a pane of glass was broken and very little damage done to the car. No one was hurt.

Bad Storm in Plainfield. (Special to The Bulletin) Plainfield, Dec. 29.—One of the worst storms of the year struck this section Wednesday. Snow, hail and rain fell and at evening there was over three inches of snow packed as solid as ice, covering the ground to the depth of several inches. The storm was particularly hard by this storm, especially the cars running between here and Norwich. Trolley cars due at 10 o'clock did not arrive until 11:30, the car due at 11:30 o'clock arrived nearly an hour late. This was due to the wires above, the hail falling on them, and the snow freezing, so that the trolley could make headway only with great difficulty.

Plows were out on the trolley lines throughout the night to keep the tracks and wires clear. The bus train got in to the New Haven station at a quarter to twelve, and the earlier trains of the day were delayed to a lesser extent. The post office men and the carriers had cause to congratulate themselves that the storm did not break during the Christmas week. Trolley Car Ran Off Track. (Special to The Bulletin) Willimantic, Dec. 29.—The Norwich trolley leaving here at 6:25 Wednesday evening left the rails at Thread Mill square and nearly caused a serious accident. The front truck on account of an accumulation of ice on the tracks left the rails and turned completely across the road, going up over the curb onto and across the sidewalk.
