ARTILLERY OF BRITISH CASINGS

At Various Points, Particularly in the Forest of the Argonne

GERMANS BOMBARD THE BRITISH TRENCHES

Big Guns of Both Sides Are Hurling Shells at Opposing Positions, From Belgium to the Vosges Mountains—Austrians Are Continuing Their Advance into Albania, With Durazzo as Their Objective Point—In West Africa the British Report the Capture of Additional German Forces.

From Belgium to the Vosges mountains, the big guns of both the belligerent sides are hurling shells at opposing positions and in addition there has been considerable grenade fighting and sniping operations. The British artillery has shelled German trenches between the Somme and Ancre rivers and British snipers have counter-attacked and destroyed by an explosion a mine crater held by the Germans north of Hulluch.
