Hartford, Conn., March 28.—Eleven races for a total purse of \$23,000 will comprise the programme of the annual Grand Circuit races at Charter Oak Park, September 4 to 9, it was announced tonight. These early closing stakes are the same as last year. Six of the events will be on the new half mile track, and the others will be on the present mile course. As usual, the principal race of the historic Charter Oak 2:08 trot for a purse of \$5,000. Another important race will be the 2:08 pace for \$3,000. The new course is expected to attract many horses in New England who have in the past hesitated to enter on the mile track.

General Felipe Angeles, often referred to as the "true patriot of the Mexican revolution" and former military adviser to Francisco Villa, explained at El Paso, Tex., how in his opinion Villa, instead of being leader of the Constitutional cause, had fallen to the status of a hunted bandit. He charged that Villa, like Carranza, aspired to be a dictator and that this and not the battles he lost caused his friends to forsake him. The general was the last of Villa's prominent supporters to quit him. He now lives a modest vegetable and dairy farmer four miles beyond the eastern outskirts of El Paso. Half a mile distant from the Rio Grande, from his front porch he can look across the Mexican territory which he is forbidden to enter. Discussing the general's rise in the Mexican revolution, Angeles said: "Villa gained power because of his wonderful energy and his personal magnetism. He had driving power, his combats were ferocious. There seems to be an impression that Villa assumed obedience by the masses. He was a commander who had but one plan of battle—to drive forward. He knew nothing of military strategy, and his advisers supplied it. He lost strategy when he lost his advisers." Villa is well informed in the use of arms.
