CORNELL TO USE FAMOUS COACH Charles E. Courtney Dean of American Rowing Coaches to End Active Service With Crews of this Season—Has Been Head Coach of Cornell Crews for Thirty Years

The blow which Cornell men have feared would fall all too soon is to descend at the close of the present rowing season. Charles E. Courtney, dean of American rowing coaches and for thirty years, more or less, head coach of the Cornell crews, announced Thursday afternoon that this would be his last year as chief of staff of Cornell rowing.

This news, coming as it does after Courtney's illness during the last June, when he suffered a fractured skull on the day of the arrival of the Cornell crew, Poughkeepsie, has been awaited with dread by every Cornell man. But the blow is lessened because of the old man's determination to continue in an advisory capacity, and that being the case he will probably continue to wield a powerful influence in the supporting of Cornell's rowing machine until his dying day.

Courtney is not a well man, and this, together with his advancing age, has led him to take the step which he has taken of taking so often. Since his injury last summer Courtney's grand old man has been under physician's care without interruption, and even has accompanied at all times by a trained nurse.

Without thinking he will reach for the megaphone and start to raise it to his mouth, when he will suddenly remember that Courtney, near the end of his life, is always and invariably in the negative and the megaphone slips back to the floor. Courtney, the wizard of the Hudson, is to all intents and purposes a little more than a passenger in his own coaching launch.

Courtney will give up his accustomed tasks with regret but it is doubtful if his regret will be equal by one-third to that of the Cornell men who will feel when the old man throws down the reins.

Perhaps the oarsmen in the Cornell quarters at the haken sense the personal loss they will feel when the old man goes and for that reason they hope that he may stay with them as long as they have at any time this season.

The peat bogs of Ireland have been so persistently emphasized in all economic discussions of the Irish people as well as in the literature of the country that the occupied individual has come to think of this island as having a virtual bog monopoly.
