That this number will be considerably increased in the future is highly probable because of the new army reorganization act, one section of which places the burden of the cost of such training upon the government.

THE WAR PRIMER. By National Geographic Society. The Isonzo front is the subject of the National Geographic Society's war geography bulletin, issued today from its Washington headquarters, which says:

"Contrary to popular belief, the Isonzo river, along which the Italians made their first attack against Austria and which has since been the scene of more than the last ten days than on the Tyrolean front, is not the boundary line between Austria and Italy, but lies wholly within Austrian territory, from two to twelve miles from the border.

"The Isonzo is the principal river of the country and crown-land of Gorz and Gradisca, which have an area about equal to that of Rhode Island. This principality and two other crown-lands, Austria, Trieste, and Carinthia, Austria's Kustenland (coast land)."

"The fighting which is now occurring on the Isonzo recalls the great battle of the Isonzo (1909) in the fifth century, when the Roman emperor Odoacer met signal defeat at the hands of Theodorich, the Ostrogoth. The Isonzo was a narrow river, and back to Ravenna, where, after a protracted siege a treaty was agreed upon. During the parley Odoacer fell before the beginning of a shower of clove his enemy from shoulder to flank with a broadsword."
