CANNOT BE LEFT TO DIE.
Contrary to expectations Sir Ernest Shackleton has returned from his second trip into the Antarctic, which was undertaken for the purpose of carrying relief to the party of 29 men who accompanied him on his polar expedition and who were left on Elephant Island when he made his dash out of that region in a small boat.

SAFE AND SANE FOURTH.

Under conditions which are prevailing today it is impossible to check the enthusiasm with which the anniversary of the Declaration of Independence by this country promises to be celebrated this year.

These are not matters which the children should be allowed to decide for themselves, but which mature judgment should recognize as calling for the exercise of parental responsibility.

The very fact that Lower California has refused to join with the rest of the Mexican republic in the support of the stand which has been taken by General Carranza, and his advisers, at the head of the de facto government, directs attention to this mountainous peninsula which runs out into the Pacific from the southwest corner of this country.

There has been little or no activity there during the revolution which has upset Mexico for the past several years and if it holds to its present attitude it will be free from it in the future.

Such ambitions, however, cannot be expected to be satisfied by aggressive action against Mexico. If they are to be obtained they should be obtained by purchase and not by conquest.
