In London When Zeppelins Came. Before the outbreak of the war the hospital corps and while residing in London, Dr. Cunningham happened to be in the city at the time of the German raid on London.

Some of the cases which Dr. Cunningham attended to had been of a very serious nature. The attention was given to the wounded men who were rushed by ambulance to the hospital base, where medical attention was given to them.
