Some interesting historical data touching the introduction or bestowment of the chief features of postal progress other than that already given may be briefly summarized as follows:

Postage stamps first issued, at New York, July, 1847. Stamped envelopes first issued, at New York, June, 1853.

Letters registered, July, 1855. Newspaper wrappers, act of congress, Feb., 1861. Free delivery service inaugurated, 1863 by Hon. Montgomery Blair, of Maryland, also the money order system in 1861, in Lincoln's administration.

The railway mail service dates from July, 1862, when Judge Holt, of Kentucky, ordered its establishment. The first railway post office being from Quincy, Ill., to St. Joseph, Mo., on the Hannibal and St. Joseph Railway.
