109 PERSONS KILLED IN RIOTS IN DRESDEN. Result of the increased sentence on Dr. Karl Liebknecht.

London, Aug. 29, 4:35 p. m.—Reports have reached The Hague, says the correspondent there of the Central News, that 92 civilians, 52 soldiers and four policemen were killed in riots in Dresden last week. The disorders are said to have been brought on by a demonstration against the imposition of an increased sentence on Dr. Karl Liebknecht as a result of his appeal from the findings of the military court. The crowds eventually were dispersed by the troops, the despatch says, after 230 persons had been arrested.

MAMMOTH PRO-ENTENTE DEMONSTRATION IN ATHENS. 50,000 Persons Met Before Residence of Former Premier Venizelos.

Athens, Sunday, Aug. 27, via London, Aug. 29, 3:30 p. m.—After the pro-entente demonstration before the residence of former Premier Venizelos today, in which 50,000 persons took part, a committee was appointed to present to King Constantine the resolutions outlined by M. Venizelos in his address. These resolutions, as framed by M. Venizelos, concluded with these words: "If we, the people, are not heard in these, our resolutions, we must take counsel what is to be done to minimize the ruin which awaits us."

The scene before the residence of the former premier was one of the wildest enthusiasm. All the surrounding streets were crowded, when M. Venizelos appeared on the balcony. News of the Bulgarian occupation of the Greek port of Kavala intensified the feeling and those in the throng apparently were ready to follow the former premier in whatever he might advise. Unusual precautions were taken by the authorities in view of the fact that the celebration occurred on the anniversary of the revolution of 1909. A large body of troops was brought in from Chalkis to reinforce the Athens garrison. Soldiers with fixed bayonets lined the streets in the vicinity of the residence of M. Venizelos.
