PRINCETON-HARVARD MEET TODAY
In Final Round of Intercollegiate Golf Championship Matches
—Yale and Princeton Played Close Matches—Official Standing of American and National Leagues Announced
—East Defeats West in Trap Shooting—Davis and Johnson to Battle Today for Tri-State Tennis Title.

Pittsburgh, Pa., Sept. 15.—Princeton defeated Yale and Harvard won from Cornell in the semi-final round of the intercollegiate golf championship on the links of the Oakmont Country Club at Oakmont today. Princeton and Harvard will play for the title tomorrow.

The match between Princeton and Yale was close, the former scoring five points to the latter's four. The score in the final round was Princeton 3, Cornell 1. This was the second time in ten years that the Eli team had been defeated and both times the Orange and Black players were the winners.

A dramatic finish featured the match that resulted in Yale's defeat. At the end of the morning round Princeton was leading by one point, winning two out of the three four ball matches. The tie, however, was broken in two points in the single contests, Davidson Heron and D. C. Corkan having won their matches and another point was needed for complete victory.

Coming to the home hole, Howard Maxwell of Princeton was one up on Paul Blossom of Yale. Blossom, who had fifteen feet short of the green, Maxwell stood his second into the trap to the left of the green. The champion laid his third virtually dead, in playing out of the trap, the Princeton player over-ran the pin, fifteen feet to the hole and putting Yale out of the edge of the cup and then sank, leaving the hole and putting Yale out of the running for the team championship.

Harvard did not encounter serious opposition in winning from Cornell, although virtually all of the matches were close. As a result of their showing today Princeton is the favorite in the finals with Harvard tomorrow.
