1916 FOOTBALL SEASON OPENS
Eastern College Elvens Play Initial Games Today—Holy Cross and Conn. Aggies Contest Expected to Feature—Braves on the Downward Path—Riverview Club Closes Baseball Season Today.

The initial games of the eastern football season of 1916 will be played on college gridirons today, when scattering contests are staged from Maine to Maryland. Only two of the leading teams of last year will make their debut this Saturday. Harvard opens against Colby, which scored a touchdown on the Crimson last autumn, and Dartmouth plays New Hampshire State, a newcomer on the Hanover team's schedule.

The other big teams of the section, including Yale, Pennsylvania, Cornell and Princeton, have selected later dates for their opening skirmishes, although a majority are already well advanced in practice routine and could enter the football arena today if the coaches so desired.

The majority of the elvens which have established football reputations of high repute are not called upon today to face opponents which are likely to test their playing strength to any great extent. Harvard, Dartmouth, Rutgers, Georgetown, Princeton and Cornell, Penn State and Bucknell are expected to emerge with substantial scores in the first game of the season.
