REPUBLICAN RALLY IN WESTERY

Town Hall Crowded to Hear Eloquent Speakers—Benjamin Hawkins on Trial in Providence—Rumored Sale of Briggs Building for One in Chain of Stores—Funeral of Capt. Horace E. Sisson.

It is almost martyrdom for a man to declare himself to be a true-blue democrat in Westery, and in consequence such a man is almost as scarce as a copperhead snake's feet. But that did not prevent the holding of a big republican rally, with brass bands and accompaniment in the town hall, Tuesday night, and, as a republican leader put it: "There is no need for republican oratory in this republican town, as there is no chance to gain converts and there is no occasion for strengthening the republicans in the faith they have in them."
