To read the morning paper and to see the headlines on the matter was settled and that the Misses Lucas would be obliged to lay gratulantly walk forthwith, whereas the only matter that has been settled is one of procedure, and it is still to be determined whether the order of the court of common council to lay the sidewalk in question, which order can be enforced. It will probably be some time before this real question can be determined by a court of final resort. It is, however, a question that should appear in the press in the interests of those who may have been misled by what has already appeared.


Will Receive Election Returns




Back from Spain.
