

IMPROVEMENT IN RUMANIA.

When the king of Rumania expressed the hope that his country would not be forgotten by the allies, and that some effort would be made to liberate the iron jaws which were being operated by Generals Mackensen and Falkenhayn from coming together, he of course realized the serious position of his country with the former pushing the Rumanians out of Dobruja and the latter striking into Rumania from the north after having driven the Rumanians out of Transylvania.

PROHIBITION GAINS.

That the liquor question played a large part in the campaigns which were carried on in many of the states was manifested by the literature that was sent forth and the efforts that were made and the efforts that were put forward. These contests did not take on national significance but they brought out a large vote nevertheless and from such figures as are available it appears that the list of prohibition states has been increased by four.

SUGGESTIONS FOR THE HOUSEWIFE.
