DARTO RESTA VINS AUTO RACE Breaks Vanderbilt Automobile Road Race Record and Captures Cup for Second Successive Time—Traveled at Rate of 86.98 Miles an Hour—Sets New World's Road Race Record—Earl Cooper Came in Second.

Santa Monica, Calif., Nov. 16.—Darto Resta won today the Vanderbilt cup race for the second successive time; broke the Vanderbilt automobile road race record by 11 miles an hour, with an average speed of 86.89 miles an hour for the 294.095 miles; set a new world's record and took the lead in the American Automobile Association's \$13,000 contest for the title of "champion driver of America." Resta's time was 3:22:48.4. It was a race unmarred by injury or death to contestants.
