New York Art Dealer Pays More Than \$15,000 For Flemish Work.

New York, Jan. 4.—A portrait of Leonillo d'Este by the famous Flemish painter, Roger Van Der Weyden, which has been on view in the Metropolitan Museum of Art since October, was sold today by Sir Edgar Speyer, its owner, to an art dealer here for a price said to have exceeded \$15,000. The panel is 10 1/2 inches and it was pointed out by experts that, from the point of view of size, this is one of the costliest portraits in existence.
