W.L. CRUSH PLAYERS' FRATERNITY Ban Johnson Declares That Dave Fultz Will Be Driven Out of Baseball

Chicago, Jan. 12.—Threats of David L. Fultz, president of the Baseball Players' Fraternity, to call a strike of between 600 and 700 players unless their demands are granted before the beginning of the 1917 season, were arrested by B. B. Johnson, president of the American League, today.

President Johnson in a brilliant statement declared that Fultz would be driven out of baseball, that the fraternity would be crushed, and that the tevery player in the American League would be obliged to sign a contract before going to the spring training camps.
