EARLY DEMOBILIZATION OF THE NATIONAL GUARD

is Forecast in Washington Comment on Mexican Situation.

Washington, Jan. 15.—Although Villa's operations have injected confusing factors into the situation in northern Mexico and along the border, there is every indication that the administration is going forward with its plans for early withdrawal of Pershing's expedition from Mexico.

Officials here have insisted that it was impossible to set a definite date for the troop movements because of the uncertainty of transportation facilities and because the situation at the border and beyond constantly is changing.

It has been indicated clearly, however, that unless there was some unexpected development, Pershing's withdrawal and the return of the guardsmen would be ordered within a few days, possibly by the end of this week.

The reports on Villa's new campaign apparently have not disturbed this determination, but officials here have some bewildered official ideas as to the real situation and in the end may operate to hold up orders until a more thorough investigation has been made.
