I've heard of some Connecticut man
who asserts that he can produce po-
tatoes at a cost of fifteen cents a
bushel with hired help. I can't do it
for that price, nor for three times
the price, even if I had all my own
land, and I don't think I could do it
with a couple of trainloads of good
bushels of potatoes, which cost me
just 42 1/2 cents a bushel to produce.

There are considerable areas in our
part of the state which will grow good
potatoes. There are other consider-
able areas which will grow good corn.
It may very well be said it has cost more
to grow corn in the immediate past,
than the corn grown would sell for.
But that's not at present prices.
And oats. And buckwheat. And per-
haps barley.

One other word—we farmers are
currently supposed to be a hard-headed,
excessively practical folk with our
eyes always on the ground, and our
"main chance" regarded chiefly in
terms of dollars and cents.
Perhaps.
