PRECAUTIONARY INSTRUCTIONS SENT ADJUTANT-GENERAL

Washington, March 16.—In preparation for any emergency, the army that may grow out of the German crisis, the militia bureau of the war department has sent precautionary instructions to all states.

In this connection it was pointed out that the government is going to considerable expense to demobilize regiments which are returning from the border and which would be held in readiness for service.

The circular of instructions advises the adjutant-general specifically of the national guard organizations in each state which would be summoned in case of recent events.

Provision also is made for the taking in the federal service of certain proportion of the state administrative staff of the national guard of each state to handle administrative questions.

Divisional or brigade commanders of the guard and their staff officers, will be taken in as they are needed by the demobilizing command.

WENCK REMOVED FROM OFFICE Governor Whitman Says Chairman of State Athletic Commission is Unfit for Position—No Successor Appointed—Governor Hopes to See Boxing Illegal—Wenck Claims It a Frame-up.

Albany, N. Y., March 16.—Governor Whitman late today removed from office Chairman Frederick A. Wenck of the state athletic commission, on the ground that he was unfit for the position by reason of "his character and previous conduct."

It was announced at the executive chamber that probably no successor to Wenck will be appointed as the governor hopes to see boxing exhibitions declared illegal in this state before the end of the present legislative session.

The charges, preferred by Harry M. Pollock, John J. White and Patrick T. Powers, were heard by Franklin Lord, the governor's legal adviser.

Mr. Lord found that Mr. Wenck had borrowed \$400, which he afterwards repaid, from Bob Kohn's manager; that he had been in the company of Kohn at the Fulton-Reich fight, and endorsed John J. Mack's note for \$2,500 during the preliminary negotiations.

MARKET WAS NORMAL United States Steel and Like Industrials Made Gains.

New York, March 16.—The calmness, amounting almost to indifference, which Wall street today accepted the strike order of the railway brotherhoods, and the upheaval in the market for other securities, were noted by impartial observers as strong proof of the market's hold-out condition and inherent strength.

Shares of the companies known to be operating on large contracts for the national government were not time adversely affected. Quite the contrary, some issues of that group were unusually active and strong.

United States Steel and kindred industrial issues made a fair degree of progress towards high prices, steel showing an extreme gain of 1 3/8 to 1 1/2 7/8.
