

WESTERLY SALES SPEEDING UP

Nearly Seventy-Five Per Cent of Allotment of Bonds Subscribed—Men Who Will Answer Call Next Sunday—Cases in Superior Court—Big Liberty Loan Parade Planned For Friday Afternoon—Gifts For Captain Robert M. Freestone.

Dr. Arthur T. Jones, secretary of the medical section, Rhode Island Council of Defense, has received an urgent appeal from the national organization for the enrollment of more Rhode Island doctors in the Medical Reserve Corps.

Rhode Island has now 73 doctors, three from Westerly, enrolled in the Medical Reserve Corps, or approximately 10 per cent of the 773 in the state.
