Antonio Turisi on Stand in Trial for Robbery at Mystic Garage. Antonio Turisi, one of the accused men, was on the stand in his own defense in the trial of the gang of Italians who robbed Backus garage in Mystic last November, in the superior court in New London on Friday morning. Turisi, who went on the stand late Thursday afternoon, denied all knowledge of the robbery and that the tires he bought were stolen. In his direct examination on Thursday afternoon Turisi stated that Madonia, another of the accused men, who testified for the state Thursday, did not stay at home in Westerly when he came to New London from New York, and that he had never seen Madonia before the night he bought the tires from him. Under cross examination by State Attorney Hull Friday morning Turisi admitted that he and J. P. Tuscano, who bought the tires, met Madonia at the railroad bridge in Westerly and that he directed them to his brother-in-law's farm in Westerly. He denied having covered the tires over with hay that night, but admitted that he and Tuscano did cover them over with hay the following day "to keep them from freezing and keep them warm." Turisi denied having refused to identify his cousin, Tony Longo, another accused man, as a member of the party from whom he bought the tires, in the county jail in New London. He also denied having sent a money order for \$50 to Madonia, State Attorney Hull asked him if there was an Antonio Turisi in Westerly and the witness said there was. The accused denied that he knew that the tires were bought from Madonia were worth \$1,500 to \$1,600 at wholesale and declared they were not worth more than \$300 or \$350 and that he paid a good price for them when he bought them for \$500. He also denied ever having talked with Madonia about robbing the Backus garage. TRANSFER CO. ORGANIZES TO OPERATE BOAT That Will Run With Passengers and Freight to Submarine Base. A certificate of incorporation has been filed with the secretary of state to be known as the Transfer company of Norwich. The company is authorized to operate steam and motorboats and engage in transfer of passengers and property also in the operation of truck lines. R. W. Perkins of Norwich, E. C. Winchester of New London and Charles B. Whiteley of New London are the incorporators. This company will cover the operation of the passenger and freight service which is to be operated by boat from Smith's Cove at Waterford to the submarine base. The boat will connect with the trolley cars of the Shore Line Electric Railway company. Two German seaplanes which have been brought to Flushing were found after an aerial fight near Zebrugge, which was clearly observed from Flushing. The aircraft have been interned.
