EVERS' ALL-STAR TEAM OVERSEAS

The Y. M. C. A. Knights of Columbus and other organizations striving to make happy the life of the soldiers abroad intend to leave nothing undone this autumn and winter to entertain the men in khaki.

Latest reports from France are to the effect that Evers is as fast as ever. The strain of increasing years has not impaired his game in the least.

The official lineup has just been announced and it is likely the tour will begin early next month. The first game will be played in Paris.

Evers has completed the lineup of his club. The coaching staff has Grover Cleveland Alexander, formerly crack moundman of the Cubs; Sherrod Smith, who used to pitch for the Dodgers; Leon Cadore, also of the Dodgers; and Charley Noyes, formerly of the Athletics.

The catchers will be Hank Gowdy, formerly star backstop of the Boston Braves, who won the signal honor of being the first ballplayer to enlist in the army.

Evers has assembled a formidable infield, too. Dots Miller, veteran of the Cardinals, who has shown for years in the National League will hold down first base.

WAR STOCKS REACTED SHARPLY New York, Oct. 7.—War stocks made further unmistakable response today to latest peace overtures of the Teutonic powers, again reacting sharply.

Gains in the peace division were sufficiently impressive at times to permit the weakness of industrial and equipment. Dividend rails scored substantial advances on further extension of federal credits and utilities augmented last week's gains as a result of the government's equitable agreement with the American Telephone company.

Home developments bore no direct relation to the course of prices, although tonnage reports at important terminals were mixed, while business conditions in western and southern sections suggested by their halting attitude the interesting changes in the foreign situation.

U. S. Steel contributed over 25 per cent to the day's diversified dealings, recovering only a small fraction of its two point reverse. Independent steels made very indifferent rallies from gross recessions of two to five points.

Kindred equipments and specialties, including tobacco, leathers and the various divisions, experienced similar reversals with numerous secondary or minor issues.

Transcontinental rails and grangers retained the course of their gains, but oils, motors and shippings cancelled much of their substantial advantage in the general pressure at the close. Sales were \$35,000,000.

Firmness of Liberty issues accompanied the progress of the current drive and foreign bonds were featured by the strength of French municipalities Paris 66 gaining 1 per cent. Total sales, net value, aggregated \$3,875,000.

Old U. S. bonds were unchanged on call.

FLY TO SPRINGFIELD Donning their football togs at Minnesota, N. Y., the army aviation football team accompanied by a squad of supporters, will step into some forty airplanes on Oct. 19 and fly to Springfield.

FLIGHT OF GAME BIRDS. While there is considerable variation in the speed of flight of game birds, the table below may be taken as the most accurate approximation of the comparative speed at which the better known wild birds fly.

Table with columns: Bird, Feet per Second, Average. Includes Quail, Ruffed Grouse, Snipe, Mallard, Wood Duck, Teal, Canada Goose, Red Head.

On the other hand, many wildfowl are jumped and killed while hovering over decoys and moving slowly, and birds like snipe and quail are often killed before they have attained full speed.
