LOCAL RED CROSS DOES VAST WORK

With about forty present the annual meeting of the Norwich Chapter of the American Red Cross was held at 8 o'clock on Wednesday afternoon in the Chamber of Commerce building.

At the annual fair of the New London County Agricultural Society, held September 2, 3 and 4, the local chapter was given the opportunity for an exhibit of its work.

As early as last spring, the rapid expansion of our work made larger quarters imperatively necessary.

During the month of December, 1917, the sale of the Red Cross seals was carried on as in former years.

Since that time we have had a considerable addition to the membership, but as a number of the enrollments during the campaign were from the Taftville chapter and a large number from out of town, and because several duplicated their enrollments, we have increased the 5,000 mark.

Garments forwarded in eleven months last year, 1,215; in the past three months, 7,755; six times as many.

Knitted articles last year, 411; in the past eleven months, 3,331. This number would have been much larger had our wool supply not been held up for long intervals.

Comfort boxes last year, 272; in the past eleven months, 2,000. These are completely filled, and 600 supplied with the "housewife" containing sewing materials, buttons, etc.

During the month of March the formal organization of the Home Service Section of the chapter was effected. James Macpherson was elected chairman and Miss Ethel Sevin, secretary.
