THE END OF THE WAR.

That the country should go wild with joy is only what has to be expected in view of the significance of the act of signing the armistice, marking an acknowledgment of the fact that militarism has been crushed and that the resumption of the war will be impossible. But the elation is by no means confined to this country, for it extends to all the allied nations, to the neutral, and to a certain degree to the central powers, for it means in the case of the defeated nations that they have been freed from the yoke of autocracy which has long hung about their necks, and that henceforth, even though they have the burden of the war to bear, it is going to mean that they will have a voice and a hand in their own government. Haughty, arrogant, domineering Germany has been brought to the bar of justice, though it has been degrading its own name for a long period of years it has been crushed and in such a manner and so effectively that it will never be able to undertake any such frightful scheme again. It has been shown that there is a greater force than it was able to create that it was a force standing for the rights of humanity against the wrong that it was defeated at its own game and that civilization and democracy have been over-riding victory the fruits of which will echo down the centuries of time.

It is a most humiliating day for militarism but a glorious one for democracy, for humanity and for right, and it is impossible to over-estimate the significance of the event which has had a hand in bringing about the results. The world's greatest war has been fought and decisively won by the side which should mean the establishment of permanent peace.

DRASTIC ARMISTICE TERMS.

The terms of the armistice which Germany was forced to sign—the terms for which it had asked after it was realized that such a course was inevitable—are decidedly drastic, but no more so than they should be in view of what is involved. By the armistice Germany is simply given the opportunity of getting out of the war slightly earlier than it would have been forced to have surrendered in the field. By no means, however, can it be looked upon as a period of rest in which the fighting machine can be repaired and set in motion again. Such a course has been guarded against. The moving spirit of the imperial German government has been eliminated, though the punishment which he deserves has not as yet been inflicted, and with him has gone the band of junkies which has insisted upon the carrying on of the war and the establishment of a central European empire. Under the terms of the armistice Germany has been disarmed and looted. The provisions are such that it cannot wiggle loose. Certain portions of the war material and the navy including submarines must be surrendered, occupied territory must be evacuated and all west of the Rhine, including certain crossing points must be turned over to the allies as a guarantee that the armistice terms will be lived up to. The result is that Germany is so completely under submission that it will never be able to do anything but comply with the demands and when the peace terms are decided upon and presented, step right up and take its medicine humble, penitent and submissive. In the meantime, however, the great wastage connected with the battlefields has been overcome. German followed its only reasonable course in signing the armistice as it did. It has escaped the destruction of property and the loss of civilian lives which others have suffered but the debt which it must pay is staggering and it is time that the ball rolling in the other direction.

OUR CONSULAR SERVICE.

Looking to the future Chairman Hurley of the shipping board calls attention to the fact that this country must take active and distinct steps looking to the extension and building up of its consular service. 
