PROFESSIONAL MARKET. New York, Jan. 10.—There was no essential change in the extremely depressed and restricted conditions which thus far this year have governed the daily session of the stock market.

The few definite developments included the December income report of the United States Steel Corporation, which showed a substantial increase of 75,000 tons, and a drop in call money, which was in fair supply at 3 1/2 per cent.

Irregularity of the bond list was occasioned by the heaviness of international, particularly French flotations, and another setback for traction, which dropped on the refusal of the local authorities to grant increased fares.
