MARKET WAS UNSETTLED. New York, April 4.—The movement of prices on the stock exchange during the greater part of today's session was extremely uncertain.

There were no specific developments in connection with the inquiry for transportation, but board members were under way which would place the railroad of the country upon a more assured basis.

Southern Pacific was the dominant feature, its advance of 4-3/4 points being attended by fierce accumulation of numerous large individual blocks.

Other trans-continental lines rose to two points and grangers strengthened on announcements that the St. Paul directors had finally entered into contractual relations with the railroad administration.

Another helpful factor, as affecting systems traversing western and southwestern territories, were the estimates of crop exports which emphasized recent reports of excellent conditions, including increased acreage.

Much of the early irregularity of market leaders was traceable to the steel dispute with Director General Hines' sudden abandonment of the Amalgamated Marine deal with the United States government and further contradictory news from the peace conference.

Stocks, motors and their specialties advanced, financial and express stocks shared most extensively with the latter movement in rails, strength prevailing at the active finish. Sales amounted to 100,000 shares.

Foreign bonds were easier, but domestic issues, including the Liberty group, reflected the better tone for high class rails. Total sales, par value, aggregated \$14,000,000.

Old U. S. bonds were unchanged on call.




