BUSY DAY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

(Special to The Bulletin.) Hartford, May 2.—The bill to repeal the act concerning the tenure during good behavior of the superintendent of the Norwich Water Works...

When the matter first came to the house there was a very firm debate, this resulted in the committee on cities and boroughs. When the bill came back in the house, there was divided report, and a floor vote was taken...

At the opening of the house session, Speaker Walsh made a statement concerning that "missing" bill in regard to woman suffrage, which created a furor in the senate Thursday...

After the batch of business from the senate was acted upon, without opposition, in its travel to the calendar, Mr. King announced that he would be making an opportune time to reconsider the vote in the governor's veto of the Sunday moving picture bill...

Matters taken from the calendar and passed included the following: The sum of \$300,000 appropriated for the state park commission for the acquisition of lands for state reservations...

When the bill on the calendar was reached raising the salary of the superintendent of fish and game, Mr. Clark objected in the ground that the state should not devote all his time to the job...

The state department of health and the Connecticut agricultural experiment station may erect and maintain the provisions of the general statutes, and subject to the provisions of section 214 of the general statutes, a laboratory building on land occupied by the agricultural experiment station in New Haven.

The necessary expenses incurred under the provisions of section 219 of the general statutes, to an amount not exceeding two thousand dollars annually, shall be paid by the comptroller...

The sum of \$82,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the purchase of land and the erection and equipment of cottages for the Connecticut School for Boys.

The sum of \$600 is appropriated for the support of pupils at the Perkins Institution and Massachusetts School for the Blind at Watertown, Mass.

An act passed fixes the salary of superintendent of fisheries and game, at \$3300 a year.

Each juror, except on inquests and as otherwise provided in this section, shall receive four dollars a day; each grand juror and petit juror, ten cents for each mile of travel from his place of residence to the place of holding the court...

The sum of \$5,000 is appropriated for the General Hospital Society of Connecticut for the maintenance of the hospital for the indigent sick in the city of Hartford.

The sum of \$250,000 is appropriated for the Mansfield State Training School and Hospital for the erection and equipment of a custodial building, canteen, dining room, school and amusement hall and an ice house...

All blind persons, or persons so nearly blind that they cannot have instruction in the public schools, who are of suitable age and capacity for instruction in the simple branches of education and who are legal residents of this state...

The sum of \$100,000 is appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1921, for the maintenance of the banking department.

The following sums are appropriated for the two fiscal years ending June 30, 1921: For construction of trunk line highways, \$2,000,000; for the construction of public or state aid roads, \$1,000,000.

The commissioner of motor vehicles on or before the first day of December, annually, shall furnish to the tax assessors in each town a list containing the names and addresses of the owners of motor vehicles as appears by the records of the motor vehicle department...

printed to carry out the purposes of the act. The state of Connecticut accords the benefits of an act which was passed...

An act passed provides that the commission of labor and factory inspection shall appoint nine deputies, two of whom shall be women, to assist him in the performance of his duties.

Every person or corporation managing or operating any factory, or owning or controlling the use of any other building where five or more persons are employed, shall provide and keep in good sanitary condition sufficient...

The house concurred with the senate in passing an act requiring owner of public motor vehicles to provide for payment of damages caused by the use of such vehicles...

Section 1. No person shall operate or cause to be operated upon any public highway any public service motor vehicle until the owner thereof shall have placed in the possession of the commissioner of motor vehicles a policy of insurance...

Section 2. This act shall take effect from the date of its passage. After discussion, the bill was passed.

THE SENATE. The committee on the judiciary reported favorably on a bill for creation of a commission and regulating the art of boxing and sparring...

For Teachers' Pensions. The committee on appropriations reported favorably on a substitute concerning a reserve fund for the payment of pensions under the retirement system of teachers.

New Britain Normal School. The committee on appropriations reported favorably on a substitute appropriating \$50,000 for the acquisition of land at New Britain for a new normal school.
