HUMAN RACE EXTINCT EXCEPT FOR BIRDS' HELP Secretary Gilbert S. Raymond of the New London County Agricultural society at a recent meeting said: "Some of the people who attend the county fair do not grasp fully the purpose for which the fair is conducted. It seems to many, doubtless, that the fair is conducted simply for a few days of amusement, the meeting of friends, exhibition of horses, cattle, sheep, swine and products of the farm, garden and orchard, but the aim and object of the New London County Agricultural society's 54th annual county fair, to be held this year at Norwich, Conn., Sept. 1, 2 and 3, is the bettering of all the conditions that affect the agricultural interests of the section of which it is the center. Among the various reasons given for the high cost of living in the present age, one feature seems to have escaped the writers and investigators on this subject, namely, the enormous toll demanded and taken from our farmers, gardeners, orchardists and foresters by the insect pests that have so multiplied and increased in the last generation that a billion dollars annually will not cover the loss from this source alone."
