

PETER NOONAN COMES IN FOR \$1,000,000 INHERITANCE


Peter Noonan, former star catcher for the Philadelphia Athletics and for the last year or more a Knight of Columbus Secretary, has inherited a fortune estimated at a million dollars, according to an announcement made from the Knights of Columbus Headquarters at 481 Fourth Avenue.

Frank Flynn, another K. of C. Secretary, just returned after several months' absence, states that he saw Noonan in Ireland just after Flynn had notified Peter of his \$1,000,000 fortune. Secretary Flynn could not tell from whom Noonan received the million, but he believes it was from a relative in the United States.

Noonan with Andy Coakley, was at one time a major star in the national game, is expected to return from Ireland, where he is at present doing athletic work for the K. of C., in a few weeks.
