

Reds Hand White Sox Severe Drubbing And Are Haired As Champions

Pat Moran's Red Legs Hammer Two Pitchers From the Box—"Hod" Eller Is Touched For 10 Safe Hits—Most Hair-Raising Game of the Series—Every Man In Cincinnati Line-up Gets at Least One Hit—Jackson Scores the Only Home Run of the Series—Moran Says He's the Happiest Man in the World—Each Player On Red Team Gets \$5,207.01.

Chicago, Oct. 9.—The world's baseball championship pennant for 1919 will be won by the Cincinnati Reds today and the deciding game against the Chicago White Sox by a score of 10 to 5.

Pat Moran's athletes invaded hostile territory today and annexed the eighth and deciding game against the Chicago White Sox by a score of 10 to 5.

As expert baseball it was as funny as a sack race. Nearly everything possible happened, including a comic four run rally by the athletes in the sixth inning. The Sox were leading 3 to 2 when the sun had not entered the lists and blinded the visiting fielders. It was all the funnier for the reason that the Sox were nine runs behind at the time.

The Reds after dropping two games on their own grounds on the night of the Ohio permitting the Sox to get back in the running for the big emblem, started after the deciding game in Cincinnati. The Sox were leading 3 to 2 when the sun had not entered the lists and blinded the visiting fielders. It was all the funnier for the reason that the Sox were nine runs behind at the time.

The remarkably good weather of the series was again in evidence and 32,936 persons paid to see the massacre of the local identity. The receipts for the series was \$36,923 and the receipts exclusive of war tax, \$723,414. Of this the players receive \$260,379.70 of the amount taken in during the first five games.

The winner's share is \$117,157.68, which will give \$5,207.01 to the participants. The salaries of most of them, it is said, The Sox players will distribute 24 shares of \$3,254.36 each.

Rath started the first inning for the Reds by popping to Risberg. Daubert took a grim swing at the spheroid and singled to center. It was the beginning of the end. Groh picked out another affable offering and sent it all into the right garden. Daubert swinging around to third. The mighty Rousch delivered himself in on the onslaught with a right, and then, again, Daubert with the first strike of the game. Groh on the throw to the plate went to third. Duncan, observing that he had made his account, swung against in the matter of drives, singled in that direction scoring Groh and Rousch. This series of giant wallops ended with a grand slam by the league pitcher for this season.

He retired to the bench and the towering James strode into the fray. He was wild and Kopf went to the mound. James stilled when he faced

Neale and the Red right fielder struck out. Rousch sent a single to center, sending Duncan home. Eller was the final out on a fly to Felsch in right.

The Sox started out as if they had solved Eller's delivery and intended to do what they did in Cincinnati the other day, overcome a four run lead for a victory. The hope was soon lived, however. Liebold singled to left and went to third on Eddie Collins' sacrifice bunt. Weaver advanced at two and missed and was informed by the umpire that he also should have struck at the third one. The runner on second and third looked foot when Weaver was called out but cheered up when Jackson grasped his bat and faced Eller. The best he could do on this occasion was a pop up to short. Felsch was even less able for he struck out, and those who had so often in this series, seen the Sox die on bases for lack of hits at the right time lost hope right there.

Again They Score. The Reds started the second with a whiff by Rath. Daubert sent a fly to center. Groh followed with a home run by beating out a grounder to Gandil and scored on Rousch's double to center. Rousch over ran second and was run down between bases.

In their half Gandil lined to Daubert and Risberg stroked. Rousch dropped Schalk's fourth strike for a moment it looked as if that might mark a change in the game, for on his next swing Schalk singled to left. Risberg going to first, and for four innings Jackson's tally alone remained in picture the fact that the Sox were leading in the fourth.

Neither side scored in the fourth, but the inning was signalized by a wonderful throw by Liebold from center to short. Eller, the inning started by Rousch's line to Gandil and Eller got on by taking one of James' wild ones in his collars. Eller reaching second, Daubert stroked to left center and Eller attempted to score. It was on this play that Liebold made his account, threw to the plate. Groh popped to Collins.

And Yet Again They Tally. In the fifth the Reds added another tally to their string and did it after Duncan had been retired hitless to the right garden. One past Gandil and way down on the line, the Sox fouled line for a triple. Neale rose to emergency with a single to left. Kopf going to first, and for four innings Rousch threw out Rousch at first.

More Runs For Reds. The Reds started the sixth with Eller up and he singled through the pitcher's legs. Rath walked and as James seemed to be weakening, Felsch was sent to the clubhouse. Daubert greeted Wilkinson, the new hurler, with a home run. The Sox pitcher, Schalk had plenty of time to force Eller

at third but threw wide and the bases were filled. Groh in the pinch struck out. Rousch singled to center, scoring Eller and Rath. Duncan joined in the melee by singling and scoring Daubert. Kopf walked and Neale hit to Weaver, who threw Rousch out at the plate. The bases, however, remained filled. With Rousch at bat, Kopf took too long a lead on second and was caught by Schalk's throw.

In the eighth Rousch got a life when hit by a pitched ball and it eventually tally. He was sacrificed to second by Duncan as registered on Rousch's single to left.

Chicago Starts a Celebration. Chicago started such fire works as they had in reserve in this inning. Liebold drove a liner to right which Neale captured on the dead run. Collins singled to center and Weaver doubled to right. Then both Collins and Weaver scored on Jackson's double in the same direction. Felsch popped to Daubert. It was here that the crowd tonight, said Moran, Pat Moran of the triumphant Cincinnati club. "I cannot praise my players too highly. They played remarkably well. There was a desire to win and there never was a time when they lost confidence."

"If Williams had shown some stuff in the first inning, we would have a different story to tell tonight," said Manager Gleason of the Sox. "But he beat the Reds, and that is the desire of the greatest series ever staged, and my hat is off to them. But I still believe the Sox is the better ball club."
