BAPTIST RESOLUTIONS LEAGUE OF NATIONS

The Connecticut Baptist state convention voted at its Wednesday session here at the Central Baptist church to meet next year with the First Baptist church at New Britain.

A resolution was passed that the convention urge the passage of the peace treaty without such amendments and amendments as would send it back to the peace conference, and another resolution passed favored the bill of pending before congress to make lynching a federal crime.
