TRAIL CLOTH THIEVES TO LEBANON

Although they had piled up behind the storehouse at the Glen Woolen Mills 15 rolls of cloth to the value of about \$4500, the gang of five thieves who had a truck in readiness to carry away the cloth about midnight Wednesday, succeeded in getting away with but two or three rolls worth about \$1200.

Dennis Houlhan, who lives across the street from the mill, heard the noise as the thieves were at work and looking out his window saw the truck and five men who were just about to load up. He got his revolver and fired six shots and the thieves, surprised at their work, scattered. The truck suddenly departed, taking with it two of the men and a part of the cloth. The other three ran down towards the railroad track and were probably picked up later by the truck which it is thought headed for Hartford.

the patrol auto with four or five men to the scene of the theft and the truck, which was a small covered one, was tracked beyond Smith's corner, where the chase was abandoned as the truck had had some minutes start of the patrol wagon. Capt. Twomey in the meantime has notified the authorities in all surrounding towns to be on the watch for the truck and thieves.

A member of the state police force was in Norwich Thursday on the trail of the thieves whose automobile tracks were followed as far as Lebanon through a peculiar mark made by the chains used on the rear wheels. At Lebanon the trail was lost because the machine ran onto hard ground where no marks were left by the chains.

No numbers carried by the machine were obtained for the thieves drove off without lighting the tail light and had only the dimmers burning in their headlights so that there was little chance to pick up the registry number.

It is believed that the cloth may eventually be located either in Bridgeport or Providence. It is of two colors, blue and gray.
