WEATHER EFFECTS BUILDING OPERATIONS

The weather of the past week has done nothing to aid building in this city, and those contractors who had started work on new buildings or work of remodeling others have been forced to give up the work for the time being.

Building in the city has been mostly confined to inside work and work on the Mabrey block on Broadway has gone ahead, the bay window that formerly projected from the building being torn down and a square window erected in its place.

CONNECTICUT BUILDING AND BUSINESS

The clearings of the New Haven banks for the past week in comparison with the corresponding week last year, show a gain of 27.2 per cent, and those of Hartford for the same period a gain of 65.3 per cent.

Partitions in bankruptcy for the week numbered three, with total assets of \$18,762 and liabilities of \$26,525. A year ago in the first week in February, two petitions were filed with assets of \$2,500 and liabilities of \$3,777.

While weather conditions during the past week have been such that little new work has been started, there is no reason to believe that the coming spring will see a considerable amount of building started, especially factory construction and apartment house work.

REAL ESTATE SALES AND MORTGAGE LOANS

There were nine sales of real estate in Norwich during the past week to compare with eight last year. The mortgage loans for the respective weeks were \$8,050 and \$22,150.

At a recent meeting of the chamber of commerce architects offered preliminary sketches, models, etc., for an industrial building for the approval of the directors of chamber of commerce. They also presented two possible sites for the building, one being on Main st. and the other near the State Pier.

Thomas C. West Co. received the contract for erecting a garage at 415 William st. for Henry H. Beaulieu of the same address. It will be 60x18 feet, one story high, of frame construction, with metal lath, plastered interior and covered with stucco.
