

WOMAN SUFFRAGE ADVOCATES OVERCOME GOVERNOR'S RESISTANCE

Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt Expresses Belief That Our Legislators Might Convene in Special Session Without a Gubernatorial Call—Pins Faith on Favorable Action in Connecticut in the Event of Failure in Delaware—Hope For a Ratification Majority in the Delaware Legislature Appears Doomed to Defeat—Opponents Are Pressing For a Vote Today.

Delaware, Del., March 25.—The Delaware legislature today cleared the way for voting, possibly tomorrow in the senate, a ratification of the proposed woman-suffrage constitutional amendment.

Reasons today were occupied in public hearings of advocates and opponents of the pending ratification resolution and leaders planned to take action tomorrow but some said a vote in either body before next week was improbable.

Opposition leaders of both senate and house are pressing for a vote tomorrow but the suffragists supporters were prepared to talk down a vote in the absence of sufficient strength.

Senator Walker, author of the ratification resolution, plans to report the measure from committee and, if reports are successful in securing additional support, propose to ask an immediate roll call.

House action was not planned until after the senate vote on the resolution, said he would not even ask a committee report because the present house minority would defeat the measure.

That suffrage leaders will turn to Connecticut if Delaware refuses ratification was indicated at today's hearings by Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt, president of the National Woman's Suffrage Association.
