Some could ratification be secured in two or three more states rather than in one. Just at present it is noted that Louisiana has declined to respond to the call of Candidate Coxe, even as it did to President Wilson. Coxe is therefore being turned to Tennessee, where there is still some doubt about the legality of action by the present legislature, and to North Carolina and Vermont and to make sure ratification in all three would be one way of overcoming an objection.

RUNNING THE RAILROADS. Just at this time when there are those who are continuing to urge the government ownership of the railroads in spite of the experience during the period of the war, it is interesting to note in the report of the interstate commerce commission for the first three months of the year that the net railway operating income is far in excess of what it was for the same period of last year. This report, based upon the operations of roads which had operating revenues above \$25,000,000 during 1919. For the first three months of that year the net operating income totaled \$54,700,000. For the same months this year the total ran up to \$58,000,000 or a gain of \$22,000,000. If that can be maintained during the year and it is to be expected that better weather conditions will lead to an improvement while the railroad lines through the outlay strikes it is to be hoped will be eliminated, the showing will be decidedly better.

PROGRESSIVES STAND FIRM. Without any doubt those who are leading the movement for a new party, whether it is considered the third or the sixth, are relying upon getting the support of the disgruntled from both of the big parties. Evidence of that has already been shown. There are those of whom such might have been anticipated who are already carrying their grievances to the convention that is assembling today in Chicago.

Democrats who failed to get what they hoped for from the San Francisco convention are expected that this body represented by the committee of 45 will fail for their proposals while certain of those who participated in the split in the republican party in 1912 are playing a conspicuous part in the organization of the new political organization. Hiram Johnson and James Reed must have seriously disappointed them when they view it is known that they would stand and work in the party where they are at present identified.

That such a party would appeal to many of the progressives who followed the bull moose organization has been expected but reliance upon any such support went a glimmering when Senator Johnson announced his position and such leadership was lost. While the resolutions adopted by a group of progressives in New York endorsing the Chicago convention and pledging support to Senator Harding show plainly that those who have been endeavoring to gain capital in that direction experienced a gross failure.

When the effort to get such a head for their ticket as Robert LaFollette, for whom practically the entire Wisconsin delegation in the republican convention stood firm from the first to the last ballot has failed. Regardless of the result at the 1912 convention it certainly does not prevail this year. The proposed party may be organized and it will appear to certain circles but the number will be small and the effect upon either of the large parties slight. From indications it will have a struggle for existence till election time.

INSIST ON ENGLISH LANGUAGE. Hawaii is threatened at all times by such the same trouble that was experienced throughout the country during the war. It is not only facts the growing influence of the Japanese but the fact that the Japanese are endeavoring to understand the effect of schools which are maintained there for instruction only in the Japanese language. The meaning of that is plain. It is the purpose to see that the Japanese children are instructed according to the Japanese ideal. Their knowledge of American ideas, customs and institutions as well as their knowledge of the English language will be only such as is needed to get along really making it secondary to the language of the flower kingdom.

AMERICA HELD IN CHAINS BY LITTLE MINDS

There is plenty of internal evidence to show that the great administrative agencies of the government are maintaining close liaison in the carrying out of the general policy of national construction. It is a policy which activates not a single department, but all departments or instrumentalities through which government directly keeps its fingers on the pulse of business, save the Manufacturing Record.

The close inter-relationship between the Federal Reserve Board and the Interstate Commerce Commission indicates that the same mental impulse is animating both and that each is getting its inspiration from identical quarters. This means that the administration "has been sold" on the question of deflation and that the American government, deliberately and after long consideration, has determined that the people of the country must do less business.

There are two reasons for this. The first is that the Federal Reserve Board has reached the conclusion that it is not able to finance the legitimate business of the country. The second is that the interstate commerce commission has reached the conclusion that the railroads cannot handle the legitimate business of the country. Each declares, in effect, that the business which it is supposed to regulate is not profitable and that the facilities which are available are inadequate. This would be suicidal in any case, but the tragic nature of it is more than ever emphasized by the fact that the Federal Reserve Board is making all its moves in making life attractive.
