CAN STATE BRING MRS. KENYON'S SIGNED STATEMENT INTO TRIAL?

Judge George E. Hinman, sitting in the criminal superior court here in the trial of Mrs. Mabel Kenyon of Stonington for the murder of Dr. Herbert Teltow in Pawcatuck, Stonington, on June 11th last, will announce his decision this (Wednesday) morning on the question of the admissibility of a signed statement made by Mrs. Kenyon to Coroner Frank H. Brown, who died on Sept. 25 last.

MORNING SESSION

When Judge George E. Hinman took the bench at 10:20 Tuesday morning and court opened, Dr. Scanlon at once went on the stand and Attorney Herbert W. Rathbun of counsel for Mrs. Kenyon, promptly contended against its admission and the point raised was argued for half an hour before Judge Hinman announced that he would give his decision in the morning.

Dr. Scanlon was finally dismissed from the stand at 2:30 and was followed by Dr. Frank J. Payne of Westerly, who was called by the state. Dr. Payne testified to being called into the Teltow house as he was passing by the office since Dr. Teltow, Dr. Scanlon called Dr. Payne in and they went together into the room where Dr. Teltow's body still lay on the floor partly blocked by the opening of the door. The doctor told of finding a bullet in the Teltow sitting room, going to the Kenyon house where he took the revolver from the bureau drawer and later to being present at the autopsy where he assisted. The autopsy showed that the bullet which caused the death of Dr. Teltow had passed through the body, except for the parts injured by the bullet, the organs of the body were found in normal condition.
