

STORY OF THE DEFEAT OF GENERAL WRANGLER'S WHITE ARMY

Bolshevik Concentration Along the Dnieper Had Been Greater Than General Wrangler Had Anticipated—Bolshevik Drive Was Started Two Days Earlier Than General Wrangler Planned to Retreat—Refugees Aboard Ships in the Bosphorus Are Undergoing Harrowing Hardships—Vessels Described as "Floating Hospitals" and "Mad-houses."

Constantinople, Nov. 22.—(By The A. P.) The first story of the downfall of General Wrangler's "white" army was given the correspondent today by one of Baron Wrangler's own officers who has just arrived here. General Wrangler's defeat was described by the officer to the over-confidence of General Wrangler and lack of appreciation of the strength of the enemy forces.

The operations across the Dnieper in October, the officer said, saw the Bolshevik concentration to be more considerable than had been anticipated. This included General Wrangler to give up his positions in Taurida and withdraw within the Crimean fortress positions, where he awaited the Bolshevik offensive.

These reserves included the Bukhary cavalry, which was reformed after the Dnieper retreat and increased with fresh units after the failure of the attempt to outflank the Kakhovka bridgehead, following which General Wrangler resolved to evacuate Taurida.

The Bolsheviks, taking advantage of the freezing period sea, crossed and outflanked General Wrangler's advanced positions across the Isthmus, appearing in considerable strength in the morning. They were enabled to advance the main body of their artillery without difficulty in gullies gave them the advantage.

In the meantime the Bolsheviks were advancing against Wrangler's right flank. The operations against over-whelmingly superior forces was magnificently. Wrangler's forces did not have time to cross or sleep before the Bolsheviks were attacking.

It is understood that the premier insisted upon the necessity of the two governments making a declaration before the Greek parliament meets, so that it may know in advance the consequences if it votes to proceed with the evacuation of the island of Corfu.

New York, Nov. 22.—The joint legislative committee investigating the alleged "building trust" won the control over the powers here tonight when Supreme Court Justice Hotchkiss denied a motion to vacate service of a subpoena for Miss Elizabeth I. DeLoach, an employee of the Builders' Supply Bureau.

Justice Hotchkiss held that if Miss DeLoach is required to appear as a witness before the committee and bring with her books, papers and records of the committee, demanded by the subpoena, application for an order vacating the subpoena was made on the ground that the committee's action in calling an employee and not an official of the firm to produce private accounts constituted an unreasonable search or seizure of the books or papers of the builders' supply bureau.
