HISTORIC COIT ELMS, AGED 170, BEING CUT BY CITY FORESTER

The large elm trees which have been conspicuous landmarks on Washington street, Norwich town, for many years have at last yielded to the infirmities of age.

They have been subject to all the vicissitudes of wind and weather and ravages of insect pests, but have been carefully guarded and supported by iron bolts and chains.

The American elm does not reach the age of the oak—200 years is perhaps about the limit—while the Waverly oaks

near Boston are believed to be at least 500 years old. But the elm, while lacking the massive, rugged strength of the oak, excels all other New England trees in varied grace and beauty.


The Connecticut Sheep Breeders' association will hold its annual meeting at the state armory in Hartford Wednesday, January 13th. The program will be as follows:
