Jess Willard Arranging for "Comeback"

New York, Jan. 25.—Jess Willard, former heavyweight champion, spent today making preliminary arrangements for his return bout with Jack Dempsey scheduled to be fought here on March 17. Willard stated that one of the first details to be settled is that regarding the site of his training camp and the engagement of sparring partners.

A number of camp quarters will be inspected early next week. The former title holder expects to go to Boston tomorrow or the next day on private business and upon his return will devote his entire time to training.

According to Ray Archer, his business manager, it is proposed to select a quite isolated camp where Willard can settle down for a six or seven week stretch of training. Locations in the mountains of New Jersey and the Adirondacks have been suggested, as well as several seashore quarters.

A tentative list of sparring partners has been compiled and from these from four to six heavies and light heavies will be selected to help condition Willard for his "comeback" fight. Fast, hard hitting boxers who can strike and take smashing blows will have the call.

A special trainer, will also be named in all probability to superintend Willard's work as well as a physician who will visit the quarters several times a week and inspect Willard for muscular or organic defects.

"No money or effort will be spared to get me in perfect condition for this bout," said Willard today. "I have asked and received a chance to regain my title and I am going about it in a business-like way. I have felt certain from the day I lost the championship that I could regain it if I ever faced Dempsey again."

"The financial terms and conditions do not interest me. I will box on any percentage or other system Tex Rickard desires and I am quite content to let Dempsey have the major end of the purse as is his right as champion."

"All the rules and conditions imposed by the New York boxing laws will be observed and obeyed and I have no suggestions or personal conditions to impose. I have asked for a chance to vindicate my boxing ability and having received it, will let my work in the ring tell the rest of the story."


