

Yale Swimming Team May Go to Honolulu

New Haven, Conn., April 13.—Plans are under way for a trip to Honolulu this summer by the Yale swimming team, intercollegiate champions of the United States. The proposed itinerary as announced tonight by Captain Loren P. Thurston at the Yale swimming banquet, includes stops at New York, Detroit, Chicago, Minneapolis, Salt Lake City, Los Angeles, San Diego, and San Francisco. Meets with swimming clubs in the various cities and also with a number of Hawaiian clubs are being arranged.

The Yale team holds several world records for relay events and also several intercollegiate records. Among those expected to make the trip are Edward Binney, Jr., of South Beach, Conn.; W. L. Belliffe, of New York; C. D. Pratt, and L. R. Thurston, both of Honolulu; R. F. Solley, of New York; H. Meagher, of Chicago; J. K. Pollard, of Northampton, Mass.; and H. Marshall, of New Haven.

C. D. Pratt, of Honolulu, star of the 220 yard event and member of the relay team that holds several records was elected captain of the Yale swimming team for next year. N. Y. Underer, of Stonington, Conn., was elected captain of the water polo team.



The usual opening day ceremonies were held, marking the debut of William Donovan as the Philadelphia manager. Score:


