

BREAK HAS COME IN THE STRIKE

LABORERS TRUCE ALLIANCE Railway and Transport Workers Have Withdrawn Support to the Miners—Split Resulted From Rejection of Miners to the Miners—Split Resulted From Refusal of Miners a Temporary Adjustment of the Wage Dispute—Secretary Hedges of the Miners Has Threatened to Resign—Government is Continuing its Recruiting of Defense Force.

London, April 15 (By the A. P.).—A moderate course recommended by Mr. Hedges, more reports in surprise than any previous day during the extraordinary industrial struggle, which is in progress, closed tonight with an air of quietude. Everywhere there was visible intense relief on the part of the public over the knowledge that the contemplated strike of the railway and transport workers had been called off, and there was renewed hope expressed that out of the conflict between the striking miners and the railwaymen and transport workers a situation would be brought about which would lead to industrial peace.

END OF VELVET WEAVERS' STRIKE IN STONINGTON

Stonington, April 15.—Weavers of the American Velvet company, who have been on strike since January 1, here today accepted the terms offered by the company Thursday and terms offered the strikers were accepted. The weavers will resume work at the mill here today. The cause of the strike was the objection weavers had over varying or trying to operate two looms. The other men claimed that was not allowed. Today Mr. Rogers, Hartford, and a committee of the weavers met and talked over the grievances. It was agreed that where the older men cannot operate a second loom they will be given a single large loom. The strike affected about 500 persons. The pay roll of the company was about \$35,000 a month.

NOMINATION OF INTERNAL REVENUE COMMISSIONER TODAY

Washington, April 15.—Nomination of an internal revenue commissioner, a position which has attracted unusual interest because the office carries authority over prohibition enforcement, probably will go to the senate tomorrow. Three members of the board of the Federal Reserve Bank, which was organized today also are to be included in tomorrow's list of appointments. It is understood that the board of appointments probably will be made and several diplomatic nominations, including an ambassador to Tokio, and several envoys to Latin American countries, also are expected.

ASKS \$10,000 ANNUAL PENSIONS FOR FORMER PRESIDENTS

Washington, April 15.—A proposal that former presidents be paid an annual pension of \$10,000 was introduced in the senate today by Senator Calder, republican of New York, and in the house by Representative Dyer, republican of Missouri. Another pension plan introduced in the house was that of Representative Rickards, republican of Ohio, providing from \$5 to \$14 dollars a month, according to the number of years of age with incomes not exceeding \$10 a week and who are attempting to earn a living if physically able to do so.

Attacks in Senate on Railroad Collision Please Top Trades

Senator Johnson of California Contends It Would Dishonor the Nation. Bul Gompers Says the Labor Board Must Have Been Influenced by "Big Business"

Washington, April 15.—The Colombian treaty was brought under hostile fire today in the senate. The republican senators of the progressive group, Johnson of California, and Lenroot of Wisconsin, attacked the pending pact for three hours as "wrong to Theodore Roosevelt" and "an invitation to every crooked nation in the word to blackmail the United States." When they had concluded, Senator Watson, democrat of Georgia, making his maiden speech, turned on administration leaders supporting ratification and accused Senator Lodge of having changed from opposition to support because of an oil concession which Secretary Fall has piped into this treaty. Despite the hot fire from opponents, administration leaders, through Senator Curtis of Kansas, assurances to President Harding that sufficient votes were in prospect to bring about ratification next Wednesday, the day set for the ratification of the treaty with its provision for payment of \$25,000,000 to Colombia for the loss of Panama and its canal rights. Senator Johnson told the senate that the treaty would be a money under the banner of economy. If the United States government had \$25,000,000 to spend, he said, it would be much better to use it for the relief of America's starving farmers, disabled soldiers and the unemployed.

Views of James R. Angell, New President of Yale

New York, April 15.—President-elect James R. Angell of Yale university, speaking tonight at a dinner tendered him by the alumni at the institution, took a positive stand for development of intercollegiate athletics and an equally firm position that American colleges should not spend money which they do not possess. "It was in no sense directing these remarks at Yale," he said, "but rather to the general collegiate situation in the country. I frequently attend meetings of the institution here to be heard until acquiring familiarity with them by careful study at New Haven. Besides the honor guest on the Dias set Arthur T. Hadley, the retiring president of Yale. The dining room was filled with one of the largest gatherings of former Yale men ever assembled at a dinner. Many of them coming here from distant parts of the country. In numbers they exceeded the record set by the alumni dinner in honor of William Howard Taft, following his election as president of the United States. Dr. Angell told the graduates that most boys work with "sufficient avidity if they feel that the object of their labor is really worth while. It is a part of the subject matter of the curriculum of liberal arts and certain of them from any values which they can themselves actively appreciate, or which their world seems to appreciate. "By way of supplementing these difficulties they have themselves created a vast body of so-called 'student activities' to which they give much of the best of their thought and energy, and from which, fortunately, they gain a good deal of highly valuable training. It is frequently at the expense of more strictly academic pursuits."

Latest Developments in Andrews' Bigamy Case

New York, April 15.—Episode following the episode today in the domestic drama of Herbert T. Andrews, the "York stock" broker, who is alleged to have housed two wives in one Jersey City apartment. The New Jersey City prosecutor, Carven announced that Mrs. Maud Andrews, Andrews' "wife No. 1," would be called before the grand jury tomorrow to recount the story of the matrimonial tangle. In New York City, Andrews' attorney announced that the man who was alleged to be the husband of "wife No. 2," Joseph Andrews, intended to start annulment proceedings. The attorneys also declared that his client was ready to face charges of bigamy and perjury preferred against him last night in Greenwich, Conn., where he recently went through his second marriage ceremony. Mrs. Maud Andrews tonight requested the prosecutor in Jersey City to allow her to make her own appearance before the grand jury tomorrow. She declared that upon advice of her counsel she would take advantage of her legal rights to refrain from testifying against her husband. Prosecutor James F. Clark, Assistant, Prosecutor James F. Clark, said that while she might be called before the grand jury Tuesday, her testimony would be of no value if she refused to testify against Andrews.

Daylight saving ordinance was passed at Utica, N. Y. For the first time in almost seven years four-fold under \$5 a barrel wholesale at the mills in Minneapolis. American steamship fleet, laden with grain, collided with the lighthouse when entering the port of Naples. Thirteen more members of the crew of the foundered steamship Colonel Bowie were picked up eight miles off Tampa. It was a cigarette stub thrown by a visitor which started the fire that damaged the historic Old State House in Boston. According to New York bankers, Ford Motor Co. has liquidated its loans with New York bankers, amounting to \$24,500,000. A bill before the Massachusetts legislature provides a penalty of \$5 for failure to vote in national, state and municipal elections. Recall of the Volstead prohibition enforcement act is proposed in a bill introduced by Representative Hill, republican of Maryland. British shipping will be paralyzed if the triple alliance orders a general strike, according to a British union delegate just arrived in New York. Germany's obligation to the allies will be fixed at between 120,000,000,000 and 150,000,000,000 gold marks by the allied reparations commission. Street corner strikers of radical nature in London during the war, a report made public by the American civil liberties union said. John Sharp Williams, of Mississippi, was the first senator to appear with a 1921 straw hat. Some of the congressmen wore overcoats. Miss Eva Lashua, 23, awoke at Winchester, Mass. after sleeping contemptuously for five weeks. Her physician believes she will recover. Spelling tests given 51,000 Philadelphia school children last week, resulted in an average of 15 per cent of the words being spelled correctly. Announcement was made that the Year Alaska company of Holbrook, Mass., will operate 2,700 acres, would resume full time operation Monday in all mills. William E. "Pussyfoot" Johnson says because of the success prohibition has proved in this country, the entire world will be as dry as the proverbial Sahara in a few years. Mexican authorities announced that the 10 per cent increase in the import duty on cotton textiles will become effective April 15, instead of April 30, as previously announced. Several coal sheds in the yards at Sprague, Brad Stevens and Newhall company in Lynn, Mass., and an adjoining wharf were burned with a loss estimated at \$100,000. American steamship West Arrow, leaving New York for Hamburg, had on board 744 milk cows and three pedigree bulls as a gift from a dairy company of Chicago. The Building Trades Council of Boston voted unanimously last night to assist in work on the party of members of its affiliated unions at pay reduction from the dollar an hour wage. Nearly \$5,000,000 in German gold coin the first such shipment since the war, arrived in New York on the steamer Stockholm from Gothenburg, consigned to Kuhn, Loeb and Company. The Meyer-Martin bill designed to put an end to fixing of prices for finished products by labor unions, was amended and virtually killed in the New York senate, by a vote of 23 to 11. Four armed automobile bandits held up a postoffice truck at Fort Wayne, Ind., and escaped with two sacks of mail. A registered mail was in the stolen pouches according to postal authorities. Secretary of Treasury Mellon announced that within a few days a letter of department will formally announce an offering of farm loan bonds to the extent of \$9,000,000, at 5 per cent per annum. Semi-annual reports from Syria state that an attack by 30,000 Turkish troops broke down completely before the Greek counter attack. The Greeks took 9,000 prisoners and a number of guns.
