DANIELSON

Title of the property occupied by the Peco Manufacturing company was transferred Saturday to that concern, subject to the interests of the Danielson Development association.

The Peco company has prospered since established here last year and is now running to capacity on a full time schedule. It was announced Saturday that the concern will at once begin construction on an addition to the plant, on Furnace street, to make space for about a dozen more looms. The plant is operating 150 looms at present and its payroll is approximately \$100,000 a year.

There is a prospect of further enlargement of the mill property of Danielson through the financial backing afforded by a number of Danielson citizens banded together in what is known as the Danielson Development association. The concern has been a success from the very start and points the way to what may be done to develop Danielson industrially, if the proper backing can be obtained under adequate safeguards, for bringing reliable enterprises into town.

The Peco company is a splendid little asset to Danielson and promises to become of increasing value as the years go by and the concern expands its production.

The plant and property of the Fernald company at East Killbuck is to be sold to satisfy the claims of creditors. It was stated here Saturday. The firm became involved in financial difficulties several months ago after starting out with splendid prospects of success.

After attachments had been placed on the property to protect claims of creditors, among them the Danielson Cotton company, which sold the Fernald company a large amount of yarn, Alfred Pate, who was prominently interested in the Fernald company, was appointed temporary receiver and later was confirmed as permanent receiver. He has since had charge of the affairs of the concern.

Since the Fernald company took over the mill and other property connected with it at East Killbuck a considerable amount of improvement work has been done there, including the putting into service of the water power, repairs to the mill and the installation of a considerable amount of machinery.

It is understood that an offer to purchase the property has been received and that prospective purchasers are willing to take it over.

A fire of suspected incendiary origin Friday evening burned to the ground a bungalow located on the road to Putnam Heights, owned by Dr. George A. Shepard of New York city. When discovered about nine o'clock by James Page, who lives near the place, the fire was blazing fiercely in the region of the woodpile on one side of the house. By the time the fire department arrived, the building was a mass of flames, and as there is no waterpump on the Heights the firemen could do nothing more than save a small shed near the dwelling. No one was living in the house, and as the fire started near a woodpile and not in the interior it leads people living in the section and others to think that it was set. The doctor uses the bungalow as a summer residence only, and it had not been occupied since last autumn. No estimates of the loss are available, as few knew anything regarding the furniture and other things which the house might contain and all of which were totally destroyed. A large number attracted from Putnam by the glare of the flames thronged to the fire, and a large number of people were seen to be taking photographs of the carnival, and many amusing themselves there came to the fire. The fire truck, No. 1, which was the only one there, was back to Putnam about ten o'clock, when the fire was beginning to die down.
