

ACCORD HARBOR TRADES A PORTION OF ST. PETERSBURG

Representative of President Harding Voiced Friendship of America for Great Britain—Predicts a Continuance of the Friendship Notwithstanding all the Mischief Makers and Scandal Mongers of Both Nations—Stated Particularly That the United States Would Not be Beguiled into the League of Nations—Responses Made by Duke of Connaught and Lloyd George.

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Proposed in Bill Introduced in State Senate—Committee Reports Flow in to Both Houses.

Hartford, Conn., May 19.—An inflow of committee reports in both branches of the general assembly convinced members this afternoon that a recess before the date of final adjournment was unlikely, and that the session would be long and the number of measures considered of importance are many.

Mr. Kent of Norwich asked Mr. Duckett, the floor leader, his opinion of the situation and the latter thought that if measures in hand are disposed of promptly it would not take more than 48 hours to complete the session.

Both houses adjourned until tomorrow. In the house session, Mr. Nickerson's report on the proposed appropriation was read and discussed.

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FOUND NOT GUILTY OF MURDER OF HUSBAND

Providence, R. I., May 19.—Mrs. Mary J. Feltow was found not guilty of the murder of her former husband, Rufus J. Feltow, an inn keeper in the town of Johnston, by a jury in the superior court here this afternoon.

"When I propose to teach I claim not only the new ambassadors to the court of St. James, but the representative of the great democracy of the west in the councils of the nation," she said.

She concluded: "We are delighted to see the United States coming, not because we want to drag America into these quarrels—that should only arise between the nations of Europe."

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
