HOUSE PASSED THE PORTER PEACE RESOLUTION, 305-61

A Substitute For the Senate Resolutions Repealing the Declaration of War—About Fifty Democrats Voted With Republicans For Its Passage—The Measure Now Goes to Conference—Republicans Overcame Opposition of Democrats by Having Hurke Cockran, Democrat, of New York, Make the Closing Argument For the Resolution.

Washington, June 13.—By a vote of exactly five to one the House tonight passed the Porter resolution to terminate the state of war between the United States and the central powers. As a substitute for the Knox resolution, already passed by the senate, repealing the declaration of war it was put through, 295 to 61, as a resolution to terminate the state of war between the United States and the central powers.
