FORECASTING REAPPEARANCE OF THE NICKEL CIGAR

The most widely quoted statement ever made by former Vice President Marshall in regard to the needs of the nation is "What the United States needs most is a good five cent cigar."

Now his statement is said to be in a fair way to be fulfilled. Leading cigar manufacturers throughout the country are planning to put on the market five cent brands, and according to cigar men the 1920 crop is quietly but steadily being bought up by the manufacturers for that end.

The purchase of the last year's crop in large quantities irrespective of the quality of the leaf would indicate that the manufacturers are planning to restore the good old five cent cigar to the public.

The vice president's prophetic words have been taken seriously by the manufacturers even if they were not meant to be so taken when they were uttered. Already the retail stores around the country have several brands of cheap cigars on the market and report that their sales are falling.

One dealer asserted that the real cause of the present decline in the price of cigars, especially in the cheaper makes and it looks as if the bottom of cigarette prices has by no means been reached.

To keep pace with the reduction of cigarettes there must be a corresponding reduction in the price of cigars. If the former tariff is passed however, it is extremely doubtful if prices will be reduced.

In reference to the higher rate of duty the United States Tobacco Journal declares editorially: "The retailer not being able to absorb this additional cost (due to the tax) will inevitably raise the price of cigars."

The reaction will result in an enormous increase in the number of five cent cigars, there is no doubt among dealers. Manufacturers are obliged to meet the demand—and the demand is now seems to be for the top of the old days, depleted by the feminine portion of the average business man.
