LOCAL AUTHORITIES REQUEST REPEAL OF LEGISLATION ALLEGED EMBELZLER

65 Moks, alleged embezzler, of No. 67 Butler street, Springfield, Mass., who was arrested last week by the Springfield police, at the request of the local authorities of this city, will be brought to Norwich to answer the charge against him as an embezzler.

Mr. Hamlin, Boston detective, Moks, it is said, claims he was paid \$400 by Hamlin to "frame up" Captain Frank W. Quilly of the Springfield police in a liquor running charge.

Hamlin, who is the complainant in the case, and who is responsible for Moks' arrest, showed up in Norwich Monday and got in touch with Attorney Babcock in regard to the case.

Attorney Babcock and Hamlin held a conference with State's Attorney Haddad in New London.

The result of the conferences is a decision to request the extradition of Moks to this city, where he will be held in custody until he can be removed to Springfield.

Attorney Babcock said Monday night that the papers will probably be completed today (Tuesday), when they will be forwarded to Gov. Everett J. Lake at Hartford.

From Governor Lake's office the papers will go to Boston to Governor Cox of Massachusetts.

In all probability Moks will be brought to Norwich some time within the next two or three days.

100 HEAD OF TUBERCULAR CATTLE CONDEMNED

Of 1,223 native cattle tuberculosis tested in July, in the campaign for the eradication of bovine tuberculosis, 100 head were condemned, 22 being slaughtered and 87 quarantined, according to the report of Commissioner on Domestic Animals James M. Whittlesley.

The work done in July was the first of the kind since the summer of 1919, when 14,000 head of cattle were tested.

The number of herds accredited as free from tuberculosis was eight, numbering 121 cattle; herds once tested and found free were 13, numbering 455 head of cattle, and the number of herds officially tuberculosis tested and all reactors removed was 13, numbering 240 head.

The following figures in cattle are being contained in the report:

Number of permits issued for dairy and breeding 51, number of permits issued for slaughter 25, number of head imported for breeding 251, number of head imported for slaughter 728, number of cattle retained 64, number of cattle reacted on test 3, number of cattle reacted on test 3.

One hundred and seventy-four horses were imported into the state in July, according to the report, of which number 194 were tested for glanders. Twenty-nine permits were issued. Seventeen native horses were tested for glanders.

One equine reacted to the test and was killed. Among native horses herds were found to be infected, according to the report, which shows that 970 were "single treated" and 1,068 "double treated" for glanders.

The number of horses treated for glanders was 1,847. In July 25 permits were issued for the importation of 91 pigs.

TWO GIRLS ESCAPE DEATH UNDER AUTO

Florence Rizzato 13 year old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Alexander Rizzato and Edna Rizzato, 15 year old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Frederick J.
