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FREE FROM DISEASE. New London county ranks second among the eight counties of the state in the July morbidity report just issued by the state department of health. Tolland county ranks first. Hartford county had more typhoid fever than any other county in the state during the previous month, having a rate of six cases per 100,000 population. Windham county had more measles than any other county, having a rate of 12.3 for Fairfield, New Haven, Middlesex and Tolland counties it was 19 and 20. The Hartford diphtheria rate was 12.3 cases per 100,000 population. Fairfield county 12.3; Middlesex county 3.9; Middlesex county 6.4; New London county 8.4; New Haven county 10.5; Tolland county nothing; Windham county 15.7.
