DECLARES 75 PERCENT MAY CARRY TUBERCULAR GERMS

"Probably 75 per cent of the tubercular germs in the system and yet they are not ill from tuberculosis, neither are they aware of the fact," declared Dr. Hugh B. Campbell, director of the state tubercular sanatorium at Norwich before the Rotary club of New London Thursday afternoon.
